Dear Friends of Imperial Valley Food Bank,

In 2023, we officially emerged from the era of COVID-19 and witnessed the fruition of our hard work from 2020 to 2022, with fewer people in the community needing food assistance. We were glad to see our positive impact and shrunken numbers. Although the numbers steadily increased due to high inflation at the beginning of February 2023, we were prepared to aid our community. Despite adversity, we stayed true to our mission.

We successfully established two new distributions—one in Palo Verde in June 2023 and another in Slab City in September 2023. These two new distributions help an additional 524 people per month. Our board worked hard to improve people's access to distribution, particularly those with transportation issues and those in more secluded areas.

In addition to furthering our reach to the corners of Imperial County, we express our gratitude to our volunteers who took the initiative to pack the food and distribute it to their neighbors. Every helping hand we receive multiplies our efforts. In this upcoming year of volunteering, we hope to ignite the inner hero of everyone in our community. And inspire them to volunteer.

Thank you to our partner agencies and donors who passionately advocate for and support our mission. Your generosity keeps us going. We will continue fighting hunger and, in the process, provide health and hope to our neighbors in need.



MONTHLY FOOD DISTRIBUTIONS & PROGRAMS

We distributed over

6.3 million pounds of food to 26,000 people each month at 34 locations across Imperial County through partner agencies, including 15 mobile food pantries run by the IV Food Bank.

These distributions are comprised of The Emergency Food Assistance
Program (federal commodities), donated local produce, and food
purchased by IVFB.



23% of seniors in Imperial County live below the poverty line. Through this USDA program, 720 low-income seniors aged 60+ are receiving 35 pounds of nutritious food each month.



1 in 3 children are food insecure in Imperial County. This program works with educators to discreetly provide 1,020 students backpacks of food each Friday so they can stay fed all weekend long.



Our bilingual team helps over 1,000 people each year navigate the application process for CalFresh (SNAP) food benefits. This helps individuals and families purchase nutritious food from local grocery stores each month.






